She moved to Florida with Tom and started her family and did not work while her raising her children. Once her children were older, Jeanne went and worked at St. Vincent's and then Conewago Elementary school teaching kindergarten. She also in 1965 graduated from Shippensburg with a master's degree in teaching.

Tom and Jeanne traveled the United states twice. Once in a car and the second time on a train to visit her brother in California. Tom played first base softball for Amvets and the Hanover Wood Heel Dodgers. Tom and Jeanne will be celebrating 65 years of marriage this June.

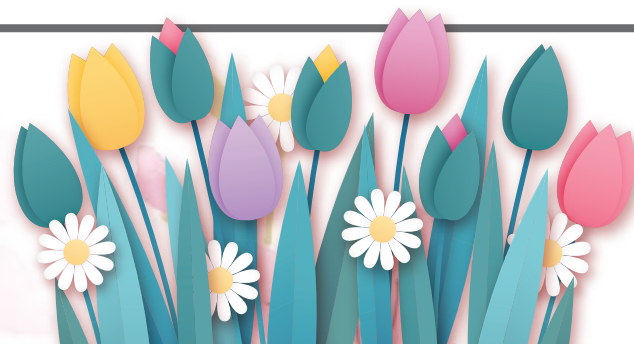

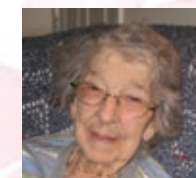
